Competition Rules

Rules amended on 29th April 2011 (change to Club Team Handicap passed by County Committee on 28th April 2011)

Rules amended on 30th July 2011 (change to Summer Pairs Competition passed by the County Committee on 28th July 2011)

Also the use of a extension to a match period was clarified which is as follows (a extension to a match period is only allowed with the permission of the short range organiser which must be obtained before the last day for shooting.) This was passed by the County Committee on 28th July

Time-Limit individual League added on page 6 approved by County Committee on 15th March 2012

Change to Shoulder to Shoulder individual competitions

To be eligible to win the concurrent individual competitions you are only allowed to miss one round of the Shoulder to Shoulder League (approved by County Committee on 24th May 2012)

Added new Trophy for Kynoch Shield Competition

The Lady Mary Trophy

Awarded to the winning Team in the Cornish Shoulder to Shoulder Final

Change to “charlie” Competition Round 1 Rules (Page 10)

(As agreed at the county committee meeting 13-02-2020)

The Stickers for round 1 will be numbered card 1 and card 2 and will be scored in that order; this will help to sort out ties, if still a tie then graduated gauges will be used.

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All shooting is governed by the National Small-Bore Rifle Association Rules unless otherwise stated

All stickers issued by the County must be fixed on to the target and then a Club Stamp or a Club Officers Initials to be covering the sticker and target before the card is shot

Winter League

Teams of four, divided in to divisions of four teams where possible.

Divisions are sorted by average of teams.

The competition is shot over ten rounds with each team shooting against each other team a minimum of two times.

Cards to be scored by County nominated scores

Each club team must have the best shooters in the “A” Team and then the next best in the “B” Team and so on.

A reserve, i.e. an unregistered shooter, may be included in any team. The current average of the reserve must be declared on the first occasion that he shoots for a team, but does not need to be declared in subsequent rounds. Where the current average of the reserve exceeds the registered average of the shooter being substituted, the score of the reserve shall be reduced by the difference, rounded to the nearest whole number above, between his current average and the substituted shooters registered average. However this does not apply in Division 1 of a league, where a reserve with any current average may be used. (Note: “Current average” shall be interpreted as the average of a shooters last three recorded scores.)

Concurrent Competitions

Each shooter must have shot all ten rounds of the Winter League

County Short Range Champion The Bickford-Smith Cup & County Silver Medal

Ladies Short Range Champion The Trago Shield & County Silver Medal

Junior Short Range Champion The Richard Cup & County Silver Medal

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Most Improved Shot

Tankard

This year's average difference in points compared to last years average

County Combined Championships

The first part of the competition is the County short range Championship, and the second part of the competition is the previous summers Double Dewar competition shot at the County open meeting.

Winter Individual League

In divisions of six and with equal averages where possible

Shot over ten rounds, one ten bull target per round.

Each round points will be awarded as follows: = 3 points to the highest score per round per division and equal, 2 points to the next highest and equal and 1 point the next highest and equal.

Cards to be scored by County nominated scorers

This competition can be shot concurrently with the Winter League and must be declared on the entry form.

If a shooter wishes to change to shooting the competition separately after the competition has started then a letter to this effect must be sent to the competition organiser so stickers can be issued.

Medals for first and second place in each division will be presented at the County Dinner/Prizegiving.

I.M.I. League

Teams of four, Shot over ten rounds

Teams can be the same as a winter league team shooting concurrently or a separate team for which competition stickers will be provided.

For the first five rounds in the competition a team will have the difference between the declared team average and the highest possible average (400) added to the gun score for each round

For example: = Team average	385.6
Highest average	400
Difference	14.4
Round gun score	384
	+ 14.4
Total =	398.4

All teams will compete against each other in each round, with 3 points given to the highest score and equal, 2 points to the next and equal, 1 point to the next and equal.

For rounds 6 to 10 the team average will be the average of the first five rounds for that team

The I.M.I. Shield and four Gold medals will be awarded to the winners

H.G. Edmonds

Teams of four shot on a knockout basis

Each team will be given a percentage of dropped points which will be added back to the gun score

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The percentage is worked out as follows: =

The average of the first five rounds of the winter league for each team

This average is then compared to the percentage chart to ascertain the percentage to be used

This percentage will remain for the duration of the competition for that year.

Each round will have a two week shooting period and cards must be returned to the marker by the Saturday following the last day for shooting. No late cards will be accepted

The Cup and Gold medals will be awarded to the winners

The Kynoch Shield Competition

A Handicap Competition between teams from Devon and Cornwall

1. The competition will be run in two sections, the teams in Devon forming one section and those in Cornwall the other.

Finalist in each County to shoot off shoulder to shoulder on an agreed neutral 25yd range within their County. The Inter-County final to be shot on the last Sunday in March (unless Easter), on an agreed neutral range within the County holding the shield. If in exceptional circumstances a shoulder to shoulder match cannot be arranged, then and only then, shall a postal shoot be arranged, the opponents shooting on a neutral 25yd range and having the shoot witnessed by specially appointed witnesses. The card shall then be sent to the N.S.R.A. for marking.

2. The Kynoch Secretary or his nominee for the County in which the shoot takes place shall be the official in charge in the shoulder to shoulder shoot. Any disputes on question of the rules shall be referred to a panel of referees, one appointed by each County, who shall appoint their Chairman before the match commences and shall have a casting vote. Challenges will only be allowed for arithmetical errors. The decision of the Panel of Referees shall be final.
3. When making entries, Club Secretaries must state the names of the members who will shoot in each team together with the start each member requires. It is not necessary to nominate reserves, but the reserves must accept the start of the member for whom they are deputising. Members may vary their start for subsequent rounds but must give three clear days notice of such alteration to the Competition Secretary stating the new start required. Cards or stickers will be issued to the clubs by the Competition Secretary, showing the competitors name and start.
4. At the County Level, no member may shoot for more than one team. For the Inter-County final, one reserve only from another team from the same Club may be substituted for a member unable to shoot.
5. A team will consist of six members from any Affiliated RIFLE Club within the two Counties.
6. Clubs may enter any number of teams, the entry fee being shown on the application form.
7. Each competitor will take a minimum start of 5.
8. The draw for the first round will be made by the Competition Secretary and teams will be drawn afresh by the Competition Secretary for subsequent rounds.
9. Not less than ten days shall be allowed for shooting each round. Individual cards may be shot at anytime during the match period.
10. Each competitor will shoot ten consecutive shots on the current N.S.R.A. Match cards in current use at 25, 20 or 15 yards.
11. Cards with less than ten scoring shots will be disqualified. The last scoring ring will be the 6 ring and any shot that falls outside this ring will be scored a miss. A competitor who places more than ten shots on his card will be disqualified.
12. When cards are scored, the start asked for by the competitor will be added to his gun score and should the total exceed 100, two points will be deducted from the total score for each point in excess of 100. Ties will be decided by the use of graduated gauges.
13. On a re-gauge, a shot that fails to score shall be counted as a miss with a score of zero instead of disqualification of the card.
14. Penalty points will be deducted after the score has been fully calculated.

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15. When a shot is placed upon a competitors card by another shooter, and the competitor shot cannot be identified without doubt by the witness, N.S.R.A. Rule 55-B (a) will apply plus a penalty of one point in excess to be applied in accordance with N.S.R.A. Rule 55-D (c). Where the competitor shot can be identified without doubt by the witness, then N.S.R.S Rule 55-C shall apply. A written explanation must accompany any card affected by cross shots.
16. Cards must be returned to the Competition Secretary in accordance with the instructions issued with the details of the draw accompanying the cards and stickers.
17. Any point not covered by these rules will be governed by N.S.R.A. Rules for postal and team knockout competitions.
18. The results will be published in the local press if possible.

Shoulder to Shoulder League Rules

1. The League is open to all clubs in Mid & West of the County of Cornwall
2. Each team will shoot against every team in the league twice during the season, on home and away basis.
3. The fixture list will be arranged by the member of the County Committee delegated to run the league (John Emmerson, 8, Treglenwith Road, Camborne, Cornwall. TR14 7JA 01209 714697). It should be adhered to as far as possible; however, variations may be made upon the submission of a **valid** reason (Rule 5) provided both clubs concerned are agreeable to the change.
4. All cards must be shot on the date of fixture in the presence of the opposing team.
- 4a. Shoulder to Shoulder league cards only are to be shot for the match. A card that can be marked on the night may be shot with the agreement of both Captains. Any card shot under this ruling has to be the 1st card shot on the night by the team member.
(Amendment Feb 1999 and Jan. 2008) Home team members may shoot prior to the match but all shooting by the home team is to be completed by 7.30 pm. Shoulder to Shoulder cards are to take preference over any other cards shot on the night.
5. **POSTPONEMENT:** = the only grounds for postponement of a fixture are: =
 - a. Exceptional bad weather i.e. making travel either dangerous or impracticable.
 - b. Illness i.e. flu epidemic.

Note: = Non-availability of one or more member of the team is **not** considered a valid reason.

C-a If any postpones at short notice for an inadequate reason then their opponents should claim the match after shooting a set of cards and sending them to the League Secretary to be scored, and the circumstances in which they base their claim.

C-b The same procedure applies in the event of a visiting team failing to appear without notice.

6. Should any amendments be necessary to the fixture list, the re-arranged match should be held in the nearest blank week of the cancelled match, the Secretary of the league should be informed of the change.
7. Teams will consist of up to But Not More than 8 members, of whom the 3 lowest scores will be Discounted.
8. The course of fire in each match will be one ten bull N.S.R.A. 1989 target per competitor. The names of the shooters being written on the back before the cards are set up.
- 8a The outcome of the correspondence from the N.S.R.A. was that they felt Open Team entry should Apply, in that instance a team may be made of anyone with regard to ability. For example, there could be a team comprising of only Ladies or Juniors or Left-handers.
- 8b The N.S.R.A. view on substitution was that a person may not shoot in more than one team in any given round.
- 8c The Committee proposed that the N.S.R.A. Ruling be accepted as a basis for the Shoulder to

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- Shoulder league except for their ruling on substation.
- 8d It was agreed that after a reserve had shot three rounds for one team they cannot shoot for another Team.
9. The Captain of the home team is responsible for preparing the targets, for recovering the targets and scoring them. The Captain of the visiting team must be in agreement with the scores recorded. The captain of the home team is responsible for preparing the score sheet, recording the individual and team scores. The completed score sheet will be counter-signed by the visiting captain and the home captain will be responsible for sending it to the league secretary with-in 24hrs of the match.
10. The league secretary will issue a league table from time to time during the season.
11. **CONCURRENT COMPETITIONS**
To be eligible to win the concurrent individual competitions you are only allowed to miss one round of the shoulder to shoulder league.
- A TEAM: = the winner of the league will receive the "Shoulder to Shoulder" League shield and 8 Gold medals.
- B INDIVIDUAL: = The shooter with the highest average score will receive the "Roselidden Bowl". (If the trophy is won by a male then the lady with the highest average score will receive silver spoon.
- C "AUSTIN DELBRIDGE TROPHY":= To be awarded to the shooter showing the greatest Improvement on their average for the season, based upon their average in the previous season.
12. **HANDICAP FINAL** All club teams in the league will compete in a Final at the end of the season, handicap being allocated to each team based upon that teams average performance during the season. This Final match will take place on one day at a convenient range. Shooting will begin at 10.00 am and the last detail will be at 4.00 pm. The organiser will **NOT** accept **ANY** range bookings after 3.30 pm. It is the responsibility of each individual to book a range place between the above times.
13. **CHALLENGES** Must be made within 20 minutes or the end of a detail; **NO LATE** Challenges will be accepted.

Western vs. Horse Shoe League

Normally shot in March each year

The match is shot one year in a Western league Club and next year in a Horse Shoe league Club

The competition is as follows

The teams are picked from the clubs shooting in the Shoulder to Shoulder leagues

The teams are made up of Ten shooters with the best Six scores to count

The teams will shot Shoulder to Shoulder on a suitable range

The cards are scored by the host Team Captain with the visiting Captain witnessing the scoring

The score is then checked against the Macrae Handicap chart to give the value of the card, the team with the highest score is declared the winners.

Time-Limit individual League

In divisions of six and equal averages where possible

Shot over ten rounds, two ten bull targets per round.

Each round points will be awarded as follows:= 3 points to the highest score per round per division and equal, 2 points to the next highest and equal and 1 point to the next highest and equal.

Cards to be scored by County nominated scorers.

Each ten bull target must be shot in 90 seconds from the command start.

Both cards per round to be shot within 2 consecutive hours.

Rounds/Bullets must be in a block/Box and not in the fingers on the command commence.

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The commands are as follows:=-

1. Attention 3, 2, 1, commence
2. The time is called every 10 seconds up to 80 seconds when you call each individual second (81,82,83,84,85,86,87,88,89,STOP)

Intermediate times may be called and competitors may use their own watch or other timing device.

Malfunctions

Allowable and nonallowable are in the NSRA hand BOOK rules and Regulations in Sector 2.1 pages 35 &36

Wilkinson Sword

Teams of five

Each member of the team must have shot in the Winter League, if this is not possible because a club has only entered one team (four shooters) then a shooter who has shot in the Winter Individual league can be used.

Teams are picked from the first five rounds of the winter league; the team will be the shooters with the top five aggregate scores.

In the case of a shooter from the individual league then it is the shooter with the top aggregate score

All five aggregate scores are added together to determine a gun score then this is compared to a percentage list to obtain the percentage of dropped points which will be added back to the gun score.

For example: =

Aggregate score	490.2
Percentage to add back	25.0%
Highest possible score	500
Gun score	488
Difference	12
Percentage to added back	3
Total score	491.0

The competition is shot on a knock out basis

The semi final and final is shot shoulder to shoulder on a neutral range if possible.

All teams members must be at that range at the time specified when the draw takes place

If a team member is missing then that team will be unable to shot.

Where any team member with a top five aggregate score is not available then a reserve may be used.

However the reserve shooter must have shot all the first five rounds of the winter leagues or winter individual but the t percentage to added back will not be changed.

The final will be as follows, each team will shot the semi final, then the third and fourth place final, followed by the first and second place final

The Sword with five Gold medals for first place

Five Silver Medals for second

Five Bronze Medals for third place

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Club Team Handicap

Teams of Four

Name your own **Team** start

Team start to be nominated on the entry form, the minimum start for a team is Twenty (20)

This is a knock out competition, with a Final at a neutral range

Each member must shoot one 10 bull target per round

Cards to be scored **ONLY** by the competition organiser, if a card is scored then it will be disqualified.

In a case of a draw then graduated gauges will be used on all the targets involved in the draw, to determine a winner.

All the team members must shoot on the same Day/Night

The declared start on the entry form must stand for the first time a team shoots in the competition.

No team may change their start without giving the competition organiser a minimum of 7 days notice of the change and receiving the acceptance of the change.

The total of the points scored on each target will be added together and the result will be taken away from 400 to give the total team score. This team score will then have the team start added to give the team score for the competition; any score over 400 will incur a penalty of Two (2) points for every point over 400.

The Final

Shot on a neutral range

The team captains and organiser will determine which team will shoot first

Only the four team members and range officer will be allowed on the range

Each team will have Twenty (20) minutes to shoot all four cards

Estimating to be done by use of telescopes only

When both teams have shot, the targets will be marked by the organiser and winner will be announced

The Cup and four Gold medals for the winners

Four Silver medals for the runners up

To be presented at the County dinner/ Prizegiving

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Competition Rules

“Charlie” Competition

Individual in classes according to averages

1st Round

1st round to be shot on a club range

2 x 10 bull targets shot on the same day/night

Cards to be sent to the competition organiser for scoring

The top **Five (5)** in each class will go on to the shoulder to shoulder final

The top five will be determined firstly by the total of the two targets first and then by graduated gauges.

Concurrent competitions

Ladies, Juniors and Veterans

The first three (3) in each of the Ladies, Juniors and Veterans will shoot at the finals

If not already in the finals then will shoot on a separate detail at the end of the finals

Finals

The final is as follows: = three (3) 10 bull targets

Each class will shoot shoulder to shoulder

The venue for the final and start time for each class will be sent out with the first round results

Ties will be decided as follows: =

1, Last card

2, second card

3, graduated gauges starting with the last cards then second card then first card,

If it is still not possible to determine the placing then they will be determined by a shoot off.

The cup and Gold medal will be presented to the highest score of the final regardless of the class.

In addition Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded in each class including Ladies, Juniors and Veterans competitions.

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Doggies & Moggies

Junior Individual Competition open to juniors aged 21 or under at the start of the winter season
Shot under Queen Alexander Rules

1st Stage

1 x 10 bull target shot Deliberate

1 x 10 bull target shot Time-Limit (90 Seconds)

1 x Skirmisher target Time (60 seconds)

On time-Limit and Skirmisher targets the rules are as follows: =

No more than three (3) sighting shots per target

Rounds to in the box/block and **Not** in the fingers on the command start

For 90 second shoot the commands are attention 3, 2, 1, **Start**

And then called every 10 seconds up to 80 seconds then 9, 8, 7,6,5,4,3,2,1, **Stop**

Any shot fired on the commands Start and Stop will be counted

Any shot fired before or after will not be counted and for every shot the highest scoring shot will not count.
Please also check the N S R A rule book for allowable malfunctions.

For 60 second shoot the commands are Attention 3, 2, 1, **Start**

And then call the last 5 seconds 5, 4,3,2,1, **Stop**

Any shot fired on the commands Start and Stop will be counted

Any shot fired before or after will not be counted and 1 hit will be deducted for each shot fired
Please also check the N S R A rule book for allowable malfunctions

The top five shooters will shoot in a shoulder to shoulder final

The Date, Time and Venue of the Final will be sent with the results of the first stage

The Final will be as follows: =

2 x 10 bull deliberate targets

2 x 10 bull Time Limit targets

1 x Skirmisher target

Any ties will be decided on the following

1, skirmisher

2, last time-limit

3, first time-limit

4, last deliberate card

5, If it is still not possible to determine the placing then graduated gauges will be used.

The Cup and County Spoon will be awarded to the winner, a Silver medal for second place, and Bronze medals will be awarded to Third, Fourth and Fifth places

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Summer Competitions

Summer indoor individual League

This is run under the same rule as the Winter Individual league

With the difference that the targets can not be shot concurrently with any other competition

Cards to be scored by County nominate scorers

Medals will be awarded first and second place in each division

The **A.S. McLaren Cup** will be awarded to the winner of division 1

Summer indoor Pairs League

This is run on a league basis with each pair shooting against each other a minimum of two times in their division.

The maximum average for a pairs is **192.99**

Each shooter in the pair will shoot 1 x 10 bull target per round, the two scores will be added together to make a total gun score for the pair

The competition will be run over Ten (10) rounds

Each division is made up of 6 pairs where possible according to averages with the highest in division 1 the next highest in division 2 and so on.

Cards to be scored by County nominated scorers

2 points will be awarded for a win

1 point will be awarded for a draw

The pair with the highest number of points will win the division,

In the event of a tie the placing will be determine by the pair with the highest aggregate scores, if still not possible to determine the placing then a shoot off will be arranged

If unable to get a winner then graduated gauges will be used

Gold Medals will be awarded to the winners of each division

Silver Medals will be awarded for second place

A substitute for one of the pair must have a declared average equal or lower than the shooter that is being replaced.

50 m/50 yards outdoor individual league

40 shots per round over five rounds (May, June, July, August and September)

Cards to be scored by County nominated scorers

In division of six and with equal averages where possible where possible

The divisions will be sorted by averages, with the highest in division 1 the next highest in division 2 and so on.

3 points for the highest score and equal per division per round

2 points for the next highest and equal per division per round

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1 point for the next highest and equal per division per round

The division winner will be the shooter with the highest total of points

If this does not determine the winner then the shooters aggregate scores will be used

Medals will be awarded as follows: = Gold medal for the winner, and a Silver medal for the runner up for each division

50 m / 100 yards Dewar Individual League

40 shots per round (20 shots at 50m and 20 shots at 100yds) over five rounds (May, June, July, August and September)

Cards to be scored by County nominated scores

In division will have six and equal averages where possible

The divisions will be sorted by averages, with the highest in division 1 the next highest in division 2 and so on.

3 points for the highest score and equal per division per round

2 points for the next highest and equal per division per round

1 point for the next highest and equal per division per round

The division winner will be the shooter with the highest total of points

If this does not determine the winner then the shooters aggregate scores will be used

Medals will be awarded as follows: = Gold medal for the winner, and a Silver medal for the runner up for each division.

County Combined Championship

1. The Brigadier Tilley Statuette

This trophy and County Gold Medal will be awarded to the Cornish Club shooter achieving the best combined score, taking together their score in the CTSA Winter League and their score in the Double Dewar competition at the County Open meeting the previous year. In the event of a tie, then the better score in the Double Dewar competition at the County Open meeting will be used to break the tie.

2. The Harvey Memorial Cup

This cup and County Gold Medal will be awarded to the Cornish Club Lady Shooter achieving the best combined score as (1) above

3. The L.S. Powell Cup

This cup and County Gold Medal will be awarded to the Cornish Club Junior Shooter (under 18 years of age on the 1st October) achieving the best combined score as (1) above.

4. The Old Codgers Cup

This cup and County Gold Medal will be awarded to the Cornish Club Veteran Shooter (over 60years of age on the 1st October) achieving the best combined score as (1) above.

The above Four trophies will be awarded at the County Dinner/Prizegiving

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County Long Range Trophies

1. The Manulife Trophy

This trophy is awarded to the Cornish club shooter in the County Open and Championship meeting who scores the highest total in the “English Match” competition. (60 shots at 50 metres). Ties will be broken by counting back the last 20 shots, then the second 20 shots. If it is still not possible to determine the winner graduated gauges will be used.

2. The Mrs. D. J. Batten Cup (to replace The Manulife Ladies Cup)

This cup will be awarded to the Cornish Lady shooter achieving the highest score in the English Match as (1) above

3. The Peninsula Plant Cup

This cup will be awarded to the Cornish club shooter achieving the highest score in Class “A” in the Double Dewar Competition in the County open championship meeting. (40 shots at both 50m and 100 yds). Ties will be broken by taking the better score at the 100yds. If it is not possible to determine the winner, then the shooter with the most “X ring bull” shots at 100yds will be declared the winner. If this fails to break the tie, then graduated gauges will be used.

4. The Archer Cup

This cup will be awarded to the Cornish club shooter achieving the highest score in Class “B” in the Double Dewar Competition as at (3) above

5. The Captain Goodman Cup

This cup will be awarded to the Cornish club shooter achieving the highest score in Class “C” in the Double Dewar Competition as at (3) above

6. The Dean Cup

This cup will be awarded to the Cornish club shooter achieving the highest score in Class “D” in the Double Dewar Competition as at (3) above

7. The C.V. Thomas Cup

This cup will be awarded to the Cornish club Lady shooter achieving the highest score in any class in the Double Dewar Competition as at (3) above

8. The E.C.L.P. Cup

This cup will be awarded to the Cornish Club Junior (under 18 years of age) shooter achieving the highest score in any class in the Double Dewar Competition as at (3) above

9. The Lord St. Levan Cup

This cup will be awarded to the Cornish club Team of Four achieving the highest aggregate score in the Double Dewar Competition as at (3) above

10. The Bolitho Cup

This cup is awarded to the Cornish club competitor with the highest score in the Grand Aggregate of all competitions in the County Open Championship Meeting.

11. The Sharpshooter Shield

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This trophy will be awarded to the Cornish team of 3 winning the “Sharpshooters” disc breaking competition in the County Open Championship meeting. In the event of neither team in the final breaking all of the 6 discs, then the team with the least number of discs remaining at the end of the allotted time (1 minute), shall be declared the winners.

Inter County Competitions

The Wincanton Cup

This cup will be awarded to the County team of 6 from any eligible West Country County (Cornwall, Devon, Dorset and Somerset), competing in a “Scottish Match” (60 shots at 100 yds) and scoring the highest team score.

A Silver spoon will be awarded to the top scoring shooter in each County team

The Kerslake Cup

This cup will be awarded to the County team of 10 from Devon or Cornwall Competing in an “English Match” (60 shots at 50 m). The competition is shot one year in Devon and the next year in Cornwall.

A Silver Spoon will be awarded to the best scoring shooter in County team

Powderam Cup

This cup will be awarded to the County Junior Team of 3 from Devon or Cornwall

The competition is an “English Match” (60 shots at 50mtrs)

A Silver spoon will be awarded to the best scoring shooter in each County team

The competition is shot one year in Devon and the next year in Cornwall.

Inter Regional Competitions

The Tamar Trophy

Normally shot in October each year

Between teams from Plymouth and District and Cornwall

A team of ten Ladies and a team of ten Gentleman

The match consists of three matches

1, A Ladies match (Mayflower Trophy)

2, A Gentleman’s Match (The Trelawney Cup)

3, A Combined Match Ladies and Gentleman, (The Tamar Trophy)

The match is shot one year in Cornwall and the next year in Plymouth, with the home team being responsible for the organisation of the match and refreshments.

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Indoor/Outdoor County Meeting Trophies

1. The Edwin Broad Cup

This cup is awarded to the Cornish Club shooter achieving the highest position in Class "A" of this competition, based on their aggregate score of 20 shots at 25 yards and 20 shots at 50 metres. Ties will be broken by firstly, by taking the better score at 50 metres, then by taking the bottom 2 diagrams of the three card system, or card number 2 when single targets are used as the last 10 shots. If this fails to break the tie, then graduated gauges will be used to rescore all of each shooters targets until the tie is broken.

We will hold a finals shoot day for the top 4 shooters to shoot Shoulder to Shoulder, the final will be over two targets with your same handicap on each card.

The handicap will not be changed for the season
